

Allow boarding to any airport in the United States for people who have originated, transferred, or transited through the People's Republic of China, the Islamic Republic of Iran, any country in the Schengen Area, United Kingdom, Northern Ireland, Brazil, South Africa, and the Republic of India during the last 14 days and that meet the following exceptions:

- I. US citizens with their respective American passports
- II. Any lawful permanent resident of the United States
- III. Any foreign resident of the United States
- IV. Any foreign national who is the spouse of a US citizen or lawful permanent resident.
- V. Any foreign national who is the parent or legal guardian of a US citizen or lawful permanent resident if the US citizen or lawful permanent resident is not married and is under 21 years of age.
- VI. Any foreign national who is a sibling of a US citizen or lawful permanent resident, if they are both single and under 21 years of age
- VII. Any foreign national who is a sibling of a US citizen or lawful permanent resident, if they are both single and under 21 years of age
- VIII. Any foreign national who is traveling by invitation from the United States government for a purpose related to containing or mitigating the virus
- IX. Any noncitizen traveling as a nonimmigrant pursuant to a C-1, D, or C-1/D nonimmigrant visa as a crew member or any noncitizen traveling to the United States as air or sea crew; Any foreign national traveling as a nonimmigrant under section 101 (a) (15) (C) or (D) of the INA (Immigration and Nationality Act), 8 U.S.C. 1 101 (a) (15) (C) or (D), as a member of air or sea crew.
- X. Any noncitizen:

- a. Who is looking to enter or transit through the United States in accordance with one of the following visas: A-1, A-2, C-2, C-3 (as an official of a foreign government, or immediate family member of an official), E-1 (as a TECRO or TECO employee or an immediate family member of the employee), G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, NATO-1 to NATO-4, or NATO-6 (or is looking to become an immigrant under one of these NATO categories); or
- whose travel is within the scope of section 11 of the United Nations Headquarters Agreement
- XI. Any foreign national who is a member of the US Armed Forces, or is the spouse or child of a member of the US Armed Forces.;
- XII. Any foreign national whose entry contributes to important United States law enforcement objectives, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their designees, based on a recommendation by the General Prosecutor or its designee; or
- XIII. Any foreign national whose entry is of national interest, as determined by the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Homeland Security, or their designees.
